Melbourne Recital Centre will take all necessary steps to create and maintain an environment that is safe from physical, sexual, emotional, psychological, and cultural harm to children and young people. The welfare of children and young people is our priority and the Centre has a zero tolerance for any behaviour that has the potential to result in harm.

Melbourne Recital Centre will periodically conduct reviews to identify risks and vulnerabilities in our programs and our organisation.
