And Stuart Skelton comes to us from the opera stage onto the concert stage for a rare recital, showing us other facets of his musical life.

Paul Lewis continues his exploration of the heartland of classical repertoire in two special performances. And violin and piano duo Tasmin Little and Piers Lane join forces for a simply gorgeous program of works. To finish the season, the virtuoso Latvian accordion player Ksenija Sidorova brings her accordion back to Australia, and rounds off this eighth season of Great Performers in a spirited and joyous way.

Soprano Measha Brueggergrosman hasn't followed the traditional career path of an opera star, pursuing a stellar stage career while multitasking as a recitalist, recording artist and author. Her musical interests are just as diverse: show-tunes, lieder, new music and mainstays of the operatic stage. She's also a vocal champion of Canadian literature and music education.

Her voice is as versatile, voluptuous and expansive as her repertoire, which ranges here from the shimmering orientalist fantasy of Ravel's portrait the legendary storyteller, Montsalvatge's sultry songs to the sly cabaret numbers of William Bolcolm and Francis Poulenc. Measha is joined by Australia's Ian Munro, the ideally simpatico collaborator for this evening of classical razzle-dazzle.

Grammy-award winning violinist James Ehnes is returning to Melbourne Recital Centre in a program exploring the solo works of J.S. Bach. Acclaimed for this dazzling technique and passionate, expressive playing, this is a musician with a singularly elegant musical voice. His solo Bach playing is simply sublime.

Bach's solo violin works are some of music's most valuable treasures. While they are the product of the Baroque, their timeless beauty and intellectual rigour resonate today. Each has a unique character: the effervescent joy of E major, the stately grace of C major and – at the very pinnacle of the repertoire – the tragic and labyrinthine D minor. The culmination and core of that suite of dances is the majestic Chaconne, a set of virtuoso variations whose transcendence has never been surpassed. The magnetic James Ehnes is justly acclaimed for his performance of these masterworks, so when he and his 1715 Stradivarius meet Elisabeth Murdoch Hall, expect to be spellbound.

His recital covers that wide range of repertoire, giving us an insight into the musical soul of this outstanding singer.

Thomas Hampson is one of the world's foremost musicians, not just a charismatic opera star but also a passionate advocate for American song, and an insightful and articulate spokesman for his art-form. At 6'4", Hampson is an imposing figure on the stage, with a baritone voice to match. You'd cast him as a leading man – tragic hero, perhaps – but he can also play a scoundrel, a devil or a buffoon. This kind of versatility lends itself to the song recital – the art of telling a dozen stories in an evening. Hampson will of course sing Mahler and Schubert, two cornerstones of lieder, but we'll also hear from his more recent excursion into the elegant world of French chanson. Rounding out Hampson's diverse resumé is his way with a pop tune, so expect some stylish standards, show-tunes and surprises.

Leslie Howard's recordings (99 CDs containing 7255 minutes of formidably virtuosic playing) and live performances reveal the multifaceted genius of Franz Liszt, a 'rock star' performer and restless innovator who pushed the boundaries of his instrument and music. Intimately familiar with Liszt's music and more than a match for the challenge of these most technically difficult of works, Howard guides us through some discoveries and delights inspired by Liszt's profound appreciation for opera. These are the ultimate Liszt party-pieces. But as always with this composer, there are surprising depths. In the process Howard reveals a complex character – refined and bold, as much a poet as a daredevil – as well as his own skills as a virtuoso pianist and interpreter of the highest calibre.

His performances of Wagner and Mahler are well known to orchestra- and opera-goers, but in this debut recital at Melbourne Recital Centre we discover another side of this great artist, delving into his other musical interests, and revelling in the rare opportunity to spend time in musical conversation with an outstanding singer. Skelton and associate artist UK-based repetiteur Richard Peirson explore rarely-heard gems by composers both familiar and overlooked.

Lewis guides us through the freewheeling imagination and wit of Beethoven's bagatelles, the beginning of the piano sonata in Haydn's innovative sonatas and Brahms' fantasies, some of the most intimate and personal music he ever penned. Paul Lewis invites you to hear this music anew.

Tasmin Little is one of the most respected – indeed one of the most beloved – musicians on the scene today. The protégée of Yehudi Menhuin, Little shares her mentor's commitment to new music, and to reaching out to audiences. Her Naked Violin project makes some of her recordings available free online to break down barriers between musician and hearer. Communication is her forte – expressing music with her gift for candour and warmth. Tasmin and her musical partner for this have a long-standing rapport. Piers Lane is no stranger to Melbourne Recital Centre audiences as a soloist of brilliance and insight. Here's a chance to hear him in chamber music from the Romantic cut and thrust of Brahms to the sinuous grace of Franck's sonata – music that celebrates the interplay of two equal virtuoso voices.

Listening to Ksenija Sidorova is a revelation. It's not just that the accordion can be an instrument of genuine virtuosity, versatility and musicality, it's also that way Sidorova plays it. Effortlessly producing a dazzling range of colour, mood and emotion, she would astound no matter what instrument she used. Sidorova is attuned both to the expressive power of music, but also to its potential for serious fun – music is, after all, the most refined kind of 'play'. Her approach has delighted audiences around the world, and now it's our turn as Sidorova performs pieces that touch on the magic of childhood, dance (the tango, naturally) and the pure tactile delight of fingers flying across a keyboard.



Grammy-Award winning 'early music superstar' Jordi Savall and two leading ensembles, Hespèrion XXI and Tembembe Ensamble Continuo, explore the inspired and energetic music of Baroque Spain and the Americas.

Savall is a multi-instrumentalist, conductor, scholar, teacher, and a record label director who has produced 230 discs since the early 1970s with a focus on Medieval, Renaissance and Baroque music. He blurs musical borders – those between past and present and east and west – while his Spanish/Catalan roots remain at the heart of his music.

The first program, Folías Antiguas y Criollas: From the Ancient World to the New World, spans music from the late Renaissance to popular music that survives today. The second program, Folías y Romanescas: The Golden Age Of The Viol, features Savall and an intimate Hespèrion XXI ensemble performing the exquisite 'greatest hits' of 16th and 17th-century Spanish, French and English music for the viola da gamba and continuo.




